What is this product?

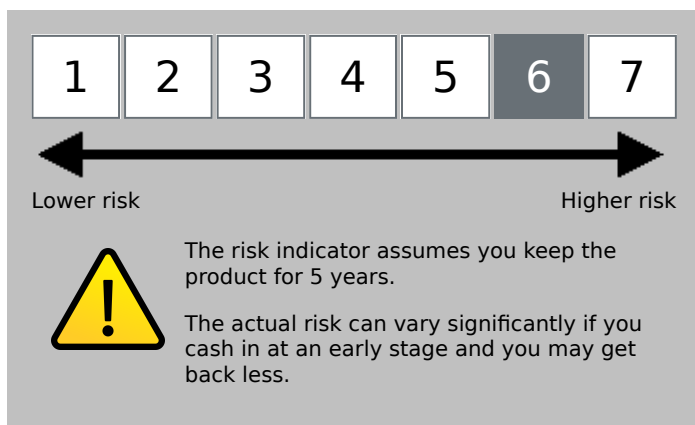
Type This product is a non-UCITS investment fund. It is a Retail Investor AIF (Alternative Investment Fund).

Objectives The Fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing on a diversified basis in the equity securities (i.e. shares) of small capitalisation companies which are listed or traded on Recognised Markets globally with no particular focus on any one country or industry.

Intended retail investor This product is intended for investors who are prepared to take on a relatively high level of risk of loss to their original capital in order to get a higher potential return, and who plan to stay invested for 5 years. It is also designed to form part of a portfolio of investments.

Maturity date This product is open ended. However, the Manufacturer reserves the right to close the product, at one month's notice, should assets fall below €4,000,000 at any time one year post launch.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



Investing in smaller cap companies carries higher risk due to lower market liquidity and possible higher volatility of returns. The fund is exposed to exchange rate volatility, as it holds assets denominated in multiple currencies. See the prospectus for overall risk information.

While not pursuing a sustainable mandate or focus, the AIFM have integrated sustainability risks as part of its investment decision - making process. A sustainability risk is an ESG event or condition that, if it occurs, could cause an actual or a potential material negative impact on the value of an investment.
